About DLM Alternate Assessment

- Alternate assessments for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities
- Grades 3-8 and high school
- English language arts, math, and in some states, science



Participation

Participation Criterion
The student has a significant cognitive disability.
The student is primarily being instructed (or taught) using the DLM Essential Elements as content standards.
The student requires extensive direct individualized instruction and substantial supports to achieve measureable gains in the grade-and age-appropriate curriculum.

Check your state's DLM webpage to see if your state has provided customized participation guidelines.



Spring Testing Timeline

- Your state has selected a specific Spring Assessment window between March 15-June 9.
- Test Administrator schedules student testing sessions.
- Check your state's DLM webpage or contact district/SEA assessment coordinator for dates.





TEST DELIVERY OVERVIEW





Assessment Design

- Each student completes a unique combination of testlets across multiple Essential Elements.
- The system uses information from the First Contact survey to determine the complexity level of the first testlet.
- The DLM assessment is adaptive.





Assessment Design

- The assessments are designed for the student to interact directly with the online assessment system, using assistive devices and support as needed.
- Some testlets are designed to be administered offline with the test administrator recording the student's response.



Assessment Design

- All students in a given grade are tested on the full blueprint during a spring assessment window.
- Total testing time for each content area:
 - ELA: 70-90 minutes per student
 - Math: 35-60 minutes per student
 - Science¹: 45-135 minutes per student
- Educators may optionally use the instructionally embedded assessments to monitor progress through the year.

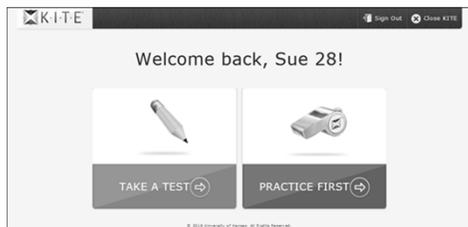

Testlet Delivery

Assessments are made up of multiple testlets.

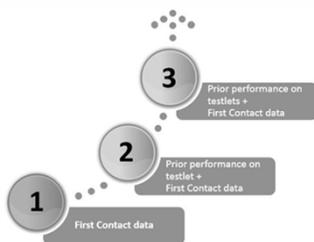
A testlet:

- Contains an engagement activity and 3-9 items
- Takes 5-15 minutes to complete
- Each testlet is assigned separately

The system adapts to the student's performance and assigns subsequent testlets based on cumulative performance information.



How Testlets Are Assigned



The Process

- Teacher goes into Educator Portal
- Retrieves student username and password
- Retrieves Testlet Information Page (TIP)
- Logs into KITE® Client with student information
- Delivers testlet to student
- Waits for next testlet



Frequency of Testlet Delivery

- During typical testing volume, the next testlet is assigned within 15 minutes after the student is identified as being ready for the next testlet

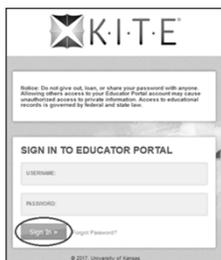


Educator Portal

- Each user must have an account in educator portal and an assigned role.

Extract includes

- Number of testlets
 - confirmed, but not started
 - in progress, and
 - completed
- 5 to 9 testlets per subject
- Testlet counts for each subject

Test Administration Monitoring Extract

- Remember, you are expecting 5 to 9 testlets per subject for the spring assessment window.
- Testlet counts are included for each subject, so a student may appear on more than one line in the extract.

How to Use Information from Monitoring Extracts

- District might monitor school participation
- School might monitor student participation
- Use to communicate with administrative staff
- Encourage teachers to monitor at their level




Additional Information

- A student will appear on more than one line in the report if rostered to more than one content area.
- A line will appear for each school in which the student is enrolled.
- The last date to view data for the 2016-17 academic year is July 31, 2017.

 - PII includes information such as a student’s name or state identification number
 - PII is unique in each state
