Self-Directed vs. Facilitated

- Self-directed modules
 - Convenient, on-demand
 - Self-paced
 - Passing score on post-test, certificate generated

- Facilitated modules
 - Include materials and instructions
 - Agenda
 - Links to videos
 - Video transcripts
 - PowerPoint slides
 - Handouts
 - Pre/post learner assessments
 - Do not require the facilitator to have expertise



Continuing Education Credit

- Continuing education credit for completed modules, whether self-directed or facilitated, is not provided via the DLM program.
- States and districts decide if credit is given for completing DLM professional development modules.
 - Module objectives
 - Author biographies
 - Time-ordered agenda
